Family historians are lucky if they have some details beyond the names and dates given in the Registry Office certificate, the Parish Register or the Burial Index which can fill in the background of the life of their ancestor. Wills can be an important source, if you can find them, for families well enough off and thoughtful enough to make them. In 2008 a further source became available and a selection is appended here.

Access to *Cengage Learning* databases using broadband is permitted to patrons of subscribing institutions like universities who access from remote locations and Derbyshire County Library in my own case and some but not all others are such. You must enquire of yours. It covers almost 50 titles of mainly local papers, alas not including the Craven Herald. The British Library whose resouce it is at http://newspapers.bl.uk gives 24 hours access for £6.99. I have used it to research the name 'Wigglesworth', not a common one, and from the ¼ million editions was directed to articles in 0.5% of them. Additionally it gives access to 2 centuries of the Times, that is over 7 million articles which include a thousand references to Wigglesworth. The number of references varies, some have none, some have them but they are in Welsh but the Leeds Mercury has almost 500 in what is an incomplete set of 14000 editions. Overall about 0.5% are relevant to WIGGS.

Care is needed to get the best from this database. Firstly the search has to be sensitive so you must use exactly the title it gives in its list of publications, for instance by clicking 'browse publications title' and copying and pasting the appropriate title. The name searched is highlighted in each entry but one has to be conscious of two things. Firstly there may be more than one use of the word in that article and secondly the article may extend to two or even three pages, each given a screen. Clearly some are duplicated in that paper but also in different ones.

This is essentially a finder's aid, in this case allowing the identification of 'Wigglesworths'. It is based on a second hand report, the essential data extracted and transcribed again and therefore is far too open to transcription errors at this level to be reliable on its own.

It throws up both the Village and Hall of that name [but not entirely detailed here] as well as the surname. Some are given as Mr or Mrs with no forename or initial, often there is just an initial with no indication of sex; felons and children are just Wigglesworth. The date of the edition [given here] and place [if given] are quoted and are the most usual clues to the actual person.

It can be full of interest. It exposes the different attitudes from the present day. Thomas Blanco was fined £5 at Wakefield Court for employing the boy Wigglesworth [age under the statutory minimum of 8] who was suffocated in Dr Gilbey's chimney [7th July 1832] while Sarah Wigglesworth at Hartwith with Winsley for concealing the birth of her child was jailed for a year at The Crown Court Assizes [15th March 1862].

In these papers, as one would expect, our namesakes were just a cross section of the population then. It more importantly reflects, for instance, what the paper thinks to report, what they can easily access and what is advertised. [The sports reports become increasingly common in the last two decades and have not all been extracted here.]

Reports of our ancestors reveal them as good or bad, ill done to, involved in politics, whatever. Some entries are tragic, some quirky. There is a preponderance of Court Reports and Bankruptcies. Attendance at social and political events reflects the times but when 1500 are entertained by the Mayor it can become tedious! A marvellous resource none-the-less.

The life revealed

What then does it show? There are relatively few mentions of our namesakes being in the forces in that period and those that are being in militias. It is only in the 20th century records in the Times that our name features in this respect, for example, as the RAF career of what I know as the 'Biggles' connection. Casualty lists remind one of the costs. Marriages record the rank of the groom, reminding one of the uncertainty.



Quite a few are in farming, often as tenants and this is often conveniently combined with being a publican. There does seem to be repeated connection with alcohol! Locals were truly local. I was pleased to see the Wigglesworth Arms in Marsden, run by the owner James Wigglesworth, featured. There was some involvement with national politics; with local politics when through, for example, a Board of Guardians, local charities for the poor and the church. One can see the establishment of Mechanics Institutes. Mind you a Wigglesworth seemingly offered inducements to voters. There was a range of work with the expected involvement with the textile trade. Horse drawn traffic, drays, furiously driven dogcarts feature but this is replaced by the railways introducing porters and an engine driver.

Births, marriages and deaths are recorded but to a more limited extent than was to become usual. From our point of view when the birth is announced before the child is named we will only know the sex and not always that. Very few multiple births feature.

As well as work, social life concerned the readers. Competitive events were not always as we have them today. Agricultural shows might have a prize for 'drainage'. 'Cottagers' gardens' were one class in horticultural shows. There were athletics events as well as, increasingly, village cricket and rugby. A Yorkshire player of Rugby Union named Wigglesworth was selected for England, but I can only find him once! As time passed as well as national societies, such as the Geological Association, local groups including Wigglesworths pursued photography or cycling as a hobby. In the evenings there were village concerts and plays featuring only locals as performers. Official events, such as funerals of the notable, were events to be attended and one looked to be recorded as being there.

Crime was reported extensively, alcohol often playing a part and we were named as both victims and perpetrators. A brothel keeper features as does a butcher [one of mine, alas] with a deceptive weight for his scales. The extent of the property involved was usually very limited reflecting the extent of people's possessions in those times. Our namesakes are numbered among the police force but only as P.C.s.

The lists following can direct you to the fuller account on the website but reading adjacent articles for their interest has often been my distraction.

ME Wigglesworth age 8 correctly answered in the children's competition 17th Feb 1883

Mary A Wigglesworth [Leeds Armley Rd] passed the second year papers of Elementary School Mistresses 18th April 1895

Mrs Martha Wigglesworth got married in Knaresborough 3rd Oct 1840 and her death was announced age 33 at Stubbs near Pontefract 16th Oct 1841

A drayman was wanted by Percy Wigglesworth, Corn Factor of Armley 28th Feb 1884

Mr R Wigglesworth was present at a funeral at Harrogate 27th Nov 1890

Mr R Wigglesworth of York was present at a dinner of the Yorkshire Geological Society 28th June 1888

Rachel, widow of Jonathan of Leeds died 29th June 1822

Robert Wigglesworth age 64, Timber Merchant, Blackburn, of R&W Wigglesworth died 10th May 1828

Mr Robert Wigglesworth of Thuscross showed the farm house owned by Wm Hardisty 8th August 1846

Samuel Wigglesworth age 56 of Horton died 27th Aug 1870

Sarah Wigglesworth at Hartwith with Winsley concealed the birth of her child and was sentenced to 12 months imprisonment at The Crown Court Assizes 15th March 1862

There was an inquest at Leeds Town Hall into the death of Sarah Wigglesworth of Hope Street. The deceased was said to be a very dissipated character! 13th Oct 1859

The death at Neston of Sarah Ann age 21, daughter of Thomas Wigglesworth of Neston, late of Thornthwaite, sister of William Wigglesworth, police officer of Leeds 25th March 1870

Sarah Wigglesworth age 61 [64?] died at Roseville Terrace, Leeds 7th Jan 1888 Sidney Wigglesworth of Manchester passed the entry to the Royal College of Physicians 12th Nov 1887

Simeon Wigglesworth, servant, of Leathley, won £5 for first prize for ploughing in Wharfedale Show 20th April 1822

T Blunn and T Wigglesworth of Leamington Priors, Silk Mercers 20th Jan 1844 Thomas Wigglesworth was one of several found guilty of affray in a pub at Penistone 20th July 1825 against whom damages of £10 were awarded.

TH Wigglesworth scored 25 runs and was involved in 5 wickets for the Yorkshire Post when playing the Bradford Observer [hurrah again! Ed] 5th July 1870

T Wigglesworth played for Thirsk 2nds against Darlington GS and took a catch for the winning side but did not bat 26th July 1880

TF Wigglesworth played cricket for Thirsk 11th July 1887

Mr T Wigglesworth greyhound Ontario was beaten at Scarborough 26th Oct 1881 Mr TF Wigglesworth's greyhound Romamby was beaten at Market Weighton 4th Nov 1881

Thomas H Wigglesworth 24 Eldest son of Thomas Wigglesworth of Hoyland Swain overlooker Messrs Benjamin Gott and Sons Leeds died 5 Nov 1831 Thomas Wigglesworth was one of seven who declared the partnership called Joshua Hopkinson and Co.

Thomas Wigglesworth of High Sheepwash Farm Rathmell lost 5 cows to cattle plague 30th Dec 1865 increased on 12th Jan 1866 and 3rd March 1866

Mr Thomas Wigglesworth was foreman at Leeds Town Hall and as such was Clerk of Works for the new Workhouse at a salary of 2 Gns a week 3rd April 1858 Mr Wigglesworth reported that the cooking apparatus was now ready but the washing apparatus was not at the new workhouse 11th Oct 1960

Mr Thomas Wigglesworth was involved in an exchange of letters about the state of a highway in Leeds 20 Jan 1865 et seq.

Thomas Wigglesworth was selected to be a surveyor for Leeds Town Council Highways Committee at a salary of £300 per annum 14th Aug 1866, 18th Aug 1866, 23rd Aug 1866 and also involved in a letter 6th Jan 1872 and in a dispute 10th Feb 1872. He was present at the trial of a new steam roller 16th Nov 1876 and in a report 26 Feb 1887

Thomas Wigglesworth presided at an election meeting held in Dewsbury 8th Oct 1868

Thomas Wigglesworth of Penistone had an apple tree full of ripe fruit including a second crop 14th Oct 1837

Mr Tom Wigglesworth agreed to withdraw his name in the election for Drighlington School Board 26th March 1892

Mr W Wigglesworth was Treasurer and Secretary of the Queen Alexandra Lodge of the National United Order of Free Gardeners, Leeds 17th Nov 1894

Mr W Wigglesworth was chairman of the Wilsden School Board 23rd Jan 1888

Mr W B Wigglesworth of Lea Field House, Garroby was married 21st Oct 1865

Mr W Wigglesworth's house Bridge Hotel, Carlinghow, Batley was used for a sale 20th April 1850

Wm Wigglesworth's death was announced at Huddersfield, a maltster, on 23 April 1814

The defendants were fined 4s 2d costs each 5th Oct 1858 William Wigglesworth age 20 pleaded guilty to horse stealing at Hunslet 3rd Dec 1869 Wigglesworth, a police officer gave the alarm about a fire at Huddersfield 1st May 1869

Wm Wigglesworth woolstapler of Stockport married 27th March 1824 Two were found not guilty of stealing a purse and money from Wm Wigglesworth at Manningham 9th Mar 1863

William Wigglesworth was charged with assault at Otley 2nd March 1878. A legal notice was placed concerning the estate of Thomas Wigglesworth of Harrogate 17th Feb 1891

The Spring Brewery [Wakefield] within the estate of William Wigglesworth was advertised for sale 23rd July 1892

Wm Wigglesworth's stock yard at Wrigglesworth Street [sic], Bank, Leeds was to be sold him being bankrupt 10th Nov 1849

The will [£72,500] of William Wigglesworth of Scarborough, late of Wakefield, a partner in Messres Hodgson and Simpson, Soap Works, Thornes, Nr Wakefield 9th Oct 1888 [Could well be the man who built a telescope at Scarborough. Ed] Wm Wigglesworth Barwick 24th Mar 1821 Tenancy

Farm occupied by Wm Wigglesworth in Hoylandswaine 28th Sept 1822

Cottage occupied by Wm Wigglesworth in Liversedge 13th Sept 1823

Wigglesworth was treated violently reportedly in a case at Wakefield 24th Dec 1868

A warehouseman named Wigglesworth claimed damages when he was run over by a dog cart being driven furiously at Quarry Hill, Leeds 19th June 1877

PC Wigglesworth apprehended a felon at Wakefield 21st July 1885 and appeared 11th Sept 1888 and 22nd Sept 1888

Wigglesworth scored a duck for Walkers Young Hopefuls [an appropriate name? Ed] 21st July 1864

Wigglesworth scored 3 and caught 1 in a cricket match between Leeds Typographical [for whom he played and which won. Hurrah! Ed] and Bradford Caxtonians Wigglesworth was successful as stumper but not as a batsman, run out for 0 for the Leeds Mercury playing Yorkshire Post 7th July 1868

Wigglesworth kicked a goal for Thornes when they won against Dewsbury 7th Feb 1882 and commended for his running and judicious tactics.

Mr Ducket of the Plough, Wigglesworth reported much improved agriculture in the area such as his potato crop 21st Sept 1850 [LM]

In the North Ribblesdale show prizes were awarded to R Ducket [The Plough? Ed] for cultivation and drainage and Lancaster of Wigglesworth Hall for horses 28th Sept 1850. Mr Duckett won a 1st prize for Drainage 29th May 1852 [LM] A man found dead in the River Ribble appears to have mistaken the light of Long Preston Station for those of Wigglesworth Hall. 6th Dec 1856 [LM]

The division into parliamentary seats subsequent on the Reform Bill was advertised including Wigglesworth village 5th March 1859

Wigglesworth wanted a certificated mistress [for the elementary school of course. Ed.] 30th Dec 1887 [LM]

An application for land in Wigglesworth for the Liverpool, Manchester and New-castle-upon-Tyne Junction Railway was advertised. 22nd Nov 1845 [PC] Jane Airton was murdered in Wigglesworth 25th Jan 1834 [PC]

Wigglesworth Hall hay meadow inundated 6th Aug 1836 [PC]
